## **SURVEY QUESTIONS FOR STATE CANDIDATES**

- 1. Allowing all parents to use tax credits and publicly funded Empowerment Scholarship Accounts (ESA) to enable their children to attend any private school, homeschool, or online academy of their choice.
- Requiring district and charter school officials, including teachers, to inform parents about their child's social, mental, emotional, or physical health.
- 3. Implementing district and charter school policies to allow students and faculty to use the restroom, locker room, and shower room based on self-identification rather than biological sex.
- Requiring signed permission from a parent before a district or charter school student may participate in any sexuality-related instruction, activities, or clubs.
- Requiring each district and charter school to post online a list of all curriculum and instructional materials being used in the classroom.
- 6. Enacting government regulation of the creed, practices, and curriculum of private schools.
- 7. Requiring government-mandated testing standards for private school and homeschool students.
- 8. Terminating Empowerment Scholarship Account (ESA) and School Tuition Organization (STO) programs.
- 9. Permitting ESA homeschool students to participate in public high school athletic programs.
- Acquiring parental consent for district and charter school faculty and staff to refer to students by pronouns that do not align with the student's birth sex.
- Making available books and instructional materials that include sexually explicit images and themes in district and charter school classrooms and libraries.

## **EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS UNDER ARIZONA LAW**

## 1. District Schools and Open Enrollment

Arizona has 238 publicly funded school districts, with more than 2,000 schools and approximately 1.3 million students. Students can benefit from Arizona's "open enrollment" policy. Open enrollment allows students to apply for admission to any district school.

#### 2. Charter Schools

Charter schools are publicly funded schools operated independently from school districts by nonprofit or for-profit organizations, though school districts may sponsor charter schools as well. As of the 2022 school year, 230,000 students attended approximately 560 Arizona charter schools.

## 3. Online Learning

The Arizona Online Instruction (AOI) program allows students to take public school classes online. For more information on the AOI program, visit the Arizona State Board of Education and the Arizona State Board of Charter Schools.

## 4. Private Schools - Tuition Scholarships

Arizona's School Tuition Organization (STO) program provides scholarships for Arizona students to attend a private school. The program allows individuals and corporations to receive tax credits for donations to STOs, which in turn STOs award as scholarships for private school tuition. # 5. Empowerment Scholarship Account (ESA)

The ESA program allows parents to receive ninety percent of state funds allocated for their child to provide a nonpublic education to their child. The program is available to every student in Arizona without limitation. Parents who sign ESA contracts for their students may use the scholarship for a variety of educational expenses, including tuition for private school.

#### 6. Homeschools

Arizona law defines "homeschool" as "a nonpublic school conducted primarily by the parent, guardian or other person who has custody of the child or nonpublic instruction provided in the child's home."
